Today we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi, also known as the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This feast of the Blessed Sacrament was established in 1246 by Bishop Robert de Thorte of Liege, and was extended to the Universal Church by Pope Urban in 1264, honoring Jesus Christ, Really, Truly and Substantially Present under the appearances of bread and wine. This Presence happens through the change which the Church calls Transubstantiation (change of substance), when at the Consecration of the Mass, the priest says the words which Christ Himself pronounced over the bread and wine, "This is My Body," "This is the chalice of My Blood."
